Thank you to everyone for your financial support, involvement in the life of the parish and community, and for your prayers! It is greatly appreciated!

Based on the current figures, we will probably have an operating deficit of about \$50,000 for this year.

During the first eleven months of the year, we have had some unexpected expenses totaling about \$25,000. Some of these unexpected expenses include replacing the air conditioner unit for the parish office, removal of trees that were in poor condition (and trimming of numerous trees), repair of the main parking lot, and repair of one of the church's furnaces. We also needed to fix the drainage line for the office's washroom due to the shifting of the building over many years.

Our operating expenses for 2024 are expected to be about \$390,000, which is less than the average yearly operating expenses between 2012-2019 (pre-pandemic times) of \$407,528.

Our Sunday Collections for 2024 are expected to be about \$260,000, which is \$20,000 below the budgeted amount. Since Covid, our Sunday collections are significantly below the average yearly Sunday collections between 2012-2019 (pre-pandemic times) of \$312,581.
