

Lent 2025

"Return to the Lord, your God for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing." Joel 2:12-18

The Lenten season begins on <u>Ash Wednesday, March 5</u>, with Mass at 7:00 p.m at Holy Child. There will be school celebrations for distribution of ashes at Holy Child on Ash Wednesday morning as well. Parishioners are invited to celebrate with St. Theresa School at 9:30 a.m. and St. Catherine School at 11 a.m. in the church.

<u>The primary themes of the Lenten season are baptism and penance.</u> We join with those throughout the world who are preparing for baptism at Easter in this time of purification and enlightenment and look at the areas of our lives in which we are not totally living as children of God.

Throughout this Lenten season we strive to grow in faith and prepare to renew our baptismal promises at Easter. As members of the global community, we journey towards 'Solidarity Sunday' on April 6 by focusing on various Development and Peace Partners in the Global South and how our 'Share Lent' donations are used to assist them in development projects. The focus for Share Lent this year is "Turn Debt into Hope", reflecting the scriptural jubilee call to address the root causes of debt and focus on people and our shared planet.

The Gospel of Ash Wednesday calls each of us to a spirit of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during the 40 days of Lent. Some suggestions for each of these are listed below.

<u>Prayer</u>

<u>Weekday Mass</u>: Many people choose to attend weekday Mass as a special Lenten community prayer time. There is morning Mass in our parish at 8:30 a.m., each Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. There will be Mass each Wednesday evening during Lent at 7 p.m.

<u>Stations of the Cross</u> will be celebrated each Wednesday evening at 6:30 p.m. before Mass. The church is also open from 9 a.m. to noon. Tuesday through Friday if you would like to celebrate the stations in private or spend some time in prayer in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel.

<u>Sacrament of Reconciliation</u>: Lent is an important time to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for the Paschal Triduum. Fr. Brian is available for reconciliation 45 to 15 minutes before every Mass in the reconciliation room.

Daily Reflection Materials Daily scripture reflection booklets are available as well as the book 33 Days to Eucharistic Glory as a special pilgrimage during this Jubilee 2025 Lenten season. Contact the office for more information.

<u>Light in the Darkness</u> All are welcome to a prayer service in support of victims of clergy sexual abuse at 7 p.m. on Friday, March 14 in the church. May the graces of this Jubilee year enable us into a synodal relationship that demonstrates a commitment to restoring justice, trust and healing for those who bear the deep wounds of clergy sexual abuse.

<u>Fasting</u>

Although the Church is not as specific about regulating fasting and abstaining from meat in the last few decades, a penitential spirit is still stressed for the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast (ages 18 to 59) and abstinence from meat (14 and older) in the Roman Catholic Church in Canada. Each individual is invited to decide what acts of penance they will offer during the Lenten season. Our acts of penance can be positive acts of love as well as the traditional fasting and abstinence from meat on certain days or "giving something up"!

Almsgiving

Lent is a time to look at ourselves and the attractions of our materialistic society and make an effort to help our brothers and sisters in need. Families and individuals may wish to choose a Lenten project of outreach to the poor locally and in other areas of the world. There are envelopes available for our Share Lent collection for Development and Peace projects which can be offered on Solidarity Sunday or at the Good Friday celebrations. Materials on development projects are available in the church foyer. Social Justice will offer a special reflection at masses on Solidarity Sunday, April 6. Donations to "Families in Need", food collections for those in need in Regina and other local programs are also welcome any time.

Please take advantage of these and any other opportunities to make this Lent a special time of purification and enlightenment, preparing to renew our baptismal promises at Easter with true open hearts and spirits.


