#### Social Justice Committee Report 2023

Our meetings are the first Thursday of the month at 7:00pm. We currently have 14 members and new members are always welcome.

Once again our parish, parishioners and community supported our fundraising efforts through a private garage sale; DECA garage sale, Fair Trade Items, Sarcan, and monetary donations.

Our Giving Tree donations were once again generous with \$535.00, with numerous pairs of socks and packages of hygiene products. Recipients were Transition House, Wish Safe Shelter, Sophia House and Isabel Johnson Shelter.

Other donations over the year were made to Anti-Poverty Ministry, Food Grains Bank, Families In Need, Period Purse, Jesuits International, Chalice Sponsorship, Ukraine Aid, South Sudan Equity (to assist in building a school), Kate's Place, Phoenix Society, Indigenous Christian Fellowship, Mental Health, Queen City Wellness Pharmacy, North Central Family Centre, St. Theresa School Hampers.

Thank you for your donations of Can Tabs, that are taken to the Pasqua Hospital where volunteers from the Gift Shop use the money from the sale of these to purchase items for the hospital. Also, for the donated eyeglasses that are taken to the CNIB, to be sent overseas.

Members of our committee, in addition to our own events, have also attended and/or volunteered at events related to Development and Peace, Regina Community Well Being (which explores Food Insecurity and Homelessness), South Sudan Equity (school building), Trauma-Informed Workshop, North Central Family Centre, Celebration of Culture at Rec. Centre, Warm Up Coalition Meeting to address Homelessness.

We also had guest speaker M J Deans-Beynham from North Central Family Centre.

#### FINANCE REPORT for 2023 Submitted by Paul Ponak 2024 AGM

Once again, this past year saw a shortfall in the operation of the Parish. A bit less than anticipated, however still a loss.

We are fortunate that the Parish is in a sound financial position, however. The reserves (\$657,000+ in the interparochial sharing) enable the Parish to withstand the deficits.

Approximately \$35,000 was withdrawn from this account during the year to ensure the operating (chequing) account was able to service the ongoing expenses. So, notwithstanding the operating deficits encountered by the Parish over the last few years, we are still in pretty good shape!

There is some positive news – a slight surplus is budgeted for the 2024 year. Also, the actual 'per contributor' average contribution is the highest in over 10 years. This is a testament that our Parishioners continue their strong support for the Parish.

Change is always constant....due to circumstances we have moved away from catering groups for, at least, the time being. For hall functions the banquet preparation/serving will be provided by a third-party.

With Greg's retirement in September a search was undertaken for the maintenance/grounds person for the Parish. As the position has not been filled, Fr. Brian has entered into contracts with a cleaning & snow removal company. This is working quite well at this time. We will continue to monitor.

There have been some staffing changes in the Parish. As mentioned, Greg retired in September & Sr. Anna Aulie retired at the end of the year. We wish them both well as they begin their 'next' chapter.

A HUGE thank you to Fr. Brian for his guidance & leadership and to the office staff for their dedicated efforts during the year. You are key to making Holy Child Parish a Welcoming place.

#### **EDUCATION AND SPIRITUAL GROWTH**

#### Submitted by Marian Grady

#### Sacramental Programs:

- Baptism, Confirmation/First Eucharist and Reconciliation: Fr. Brian works with families preparing for Baptism, using online resources. We were able to return to family centred evening sessions for Confirmation/First Eucharist and Reconciliation with materials for families to work on together at home. Fr. Brian presided at our parish Confirmation/First Eucharist celebrations on Saturday, May 6 at the 7 p.m. Mass and Sunday, May 7 at the 11 a.m. Mass. First Reconciliation was celebrated on Sunday, November 5 at 1 p.m.
- RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): Candidates for RCIA this year involved parents and children from 3 families, so they attended the parent/child parish sessions with their peers who were preparing for Confirmation/First Eucharist as well as some extra time with Marian. At the Easter Vigil we welcomed a mother who made her profession of faith with her two daughters being baptized. She and her oldest daughter also celebrated Confirmation and First Eucharist. Another mother and daughter celebrated full initiation that evening. Another family, with a mother and three children, who were not able to celebrate at the Easter Vigil, celebrated full initiation with the parish on Pentecost Sunday.

#### Spiritual Formation:

- Sunday to Sunday Bible Study Sr Anna's group continued to gather weekly and focus on the Sunday scriptures in the Kubash Room on a regular basis.
- Seasonal Materials- Reflection materials for Advent/Christmas and Lent,
   Sunday missals and religious art calendars were available for interested parishioners.
- Parish Home Ministry Due to continuing health concerns, ministry to the sick and housebound is limited, but several family members continue to bring communion to their loved ones and Fr. Brian is available when needed. Some parishioners are also involved in hospital ministry, especially on Sundays at Wascana, following health ministry protocol for volunteers.

This past year has been a time of learning to go in a new direction with trust and gratitude. As we journey together, we are encouraged to root ourselves in Christ, recognizing His generosity and unceasing care for us in all things.

Part of our learning and new direction has involved changes with staff. After 13 years of dedicated service to the Holy Child Parish community, Sr. Anna Aulie completed her time on the parish staff at the end of December. Thank you, Sr. Anna, for your caring presence. We look forward to accompanying you on the new stage of your journey. The parish also extends a big "Thank You" to Greg Lett for all his hard work during his 37 years of dedicated and generous service to keep the building and grounds in top form and in providing the excellent maintenance support for various events. We wish Greg good health and happiness in his retirement.

After advertising twice for a caretaker, we were unsuccessful in filling the position. Therefore, various caretaking tasks such as overall cleaning, light bulb replacement, snow clearing, furnace maintenance are currently contracted with various companies. This approach will continue for the upcoming year. Set up and take down of tables and chairs, along with some other manageable maintenance tasks, is being handled through the assistance of current staff, volunteers, and user groups.

We have been blessed with excellent, dedicated, faith-filled, and supportive staff, pastoral council members, finance council members, volunteers in various ministries and groups, and parishioners of every age and nationality. My heart is filled with gratitude for you! You walk by faith and love, and you treat the parish as your home. May God bless each of you with joy, peace, and love in your journey with Christ and one another!

The committee decided to maintain services and staff for the future of the parish. The main factor in the parish's rebound is improved attendance. This has been happening the last few months with donations up \$5,000 to \$6,000 at the end of February. However, expenses are also up with utility costs. The parish is in good financial standing notwithstanding the last couple of years.
